everyone!







































Move over Paul Hollywood, Mary Berry and Nadia Hussain! There are some new 'Great British Bakers' on the block and they are in Year 3!

What fantastic artists we have in Year 4! Children have also been busy brushing up their French skills, keeping up with their reading and learning about animals in science. Good job year 4.


