- North America is a continent entirely within the Northern Hemisphere and almost all within the Western Hemisphere.
- There are 23 countries in North America, with Canada being the biggest.
- South America is a continent in the Western
 Hemisphere, mostly in the Southern Hemisphere, with a
 relatively small portion in the Northern Hemisphere. There
 are 12 countries in South America and almost 400 million
 people live there.
- Brazil is the largest country and covers almost half the continent. It is only slightly smaller than the USA.





Glossary

physical characteristic — These include bodies of water and landforms, for example, oceans, mountains, lakes, rivers, plateaus, plains, streams, hills, bays, gulfs, volcanoes, canyons, valleys and peninsulas are all various physical features. Anything that describes the Earth's topography is a physical feature.

human characteristic - These are created by humans and include roads, bridges, dams, reservoirs, factories, houses and buildings.

Incas - The largest group of indigenous people in South America when the Europeans arrived.
