Please take a look at knowledge organisers your child has brought home. These will support with their learning and knowledge retention of key facts, such as dates and new vocabulary, as well as providing you with more detail about our curriculum

English: This term, the children will be exploring a range of text types. Class 3 will be reading 'The Incredible Book **Eating Boy'.** Children will be exploring the different techniques used by the author and applying these to write a story based on the text.

Make sure that you practise your spellings for your Spelling Challenge. Can you keep a weekend diary? Write down some of the things that you do and to share it with your class. They will also write an explanation text 'How a Robot Dog works'.

**Mathematics** This term children will be developing their understanding of number and formal written methods to add, subtract, multiply and divide. Children will further develop their understanding of time, working with both analogue and digital clocks. You can help our children by practising reading the time at home. There will continue to be a particular focus on mental maths (arithmetic). We will also be applying these skills to reason and solve problems in real life contexts, where children are asked to talk about their answer and explain how they got there. Our times table focus will be  $x_3$ ,  $x_4$  and  $x_8$ . At home and in school. the children will be able to access the **Times Table Rock Stars** website (https://ttrockstars.com/login). A login and password are recorded in your child's Learning Journal. Every two weeks, children will be tested on their Times Table Maths Challenge in class.

Science: This term we will be exploring our topic Rocks and Soils. Children will learn to identify and sort different rocks and investigate their properties. We will also explore how fossils are formed. How many different types of rocks can our name? What is soil made of?

**Music:** Throughout our music lessons, children will be learning to read musical notation, play the recorder and perform as part of a group. At home listen to some classical music from the composer Chopin. The children will use maps to locate and name the hills and mountains within the United Kingdom. They will be learning about human features (features created by humans such as roads and bridges) and physical features (naturally occurring land features such as lakes, rivers and seas). Art: This term we will focus on **drawing** and **sculpture**. We will be learning to use varied drawing techniques to create shades and patterns. We will also explore 3D sculptures. **DT:** Our topic this term is **Food Glorious Food.** We will be learning about healthy and varied diets and where our food comes from. Children will have opportunities to practise their food preparation skills, eventually designing, creating and evaluating their own product.

**<u>RE</u>**: Children will be learning about how different religions **give thanks** focusing on Christianity, Islam and Sikhism. You might like to discuss how your family gives thanks with your child.

**PSHE:** Our focus this term is on relationships and we will be discussing **families and communities**. We will introduce these topics through stories. We will also be learning about Rights, Responsibilities and British Values through our lessons and assemblies.
